It is great to be back at school and into the swing of things. Everyone seems refreshed and ready to learn after a good summer holiday break.

Welcome to Mrs Valentina Alvarez Farias who is team teaching in the Senior Learning Team with Mrs Hazel Astley and myself, full time this term. Valentina has relieved lots at our school and knows all our students well. We also welcome Miss Amy Bennett to the Junior Learning Team. Amy is a third year teaching student from the University of Otago and is completing her final year placement in the Junior Learning Team, supported by Miss Renee Hodges. Amy is with us for the year and will be doing some block postings along with being here each Tuesday. It is great to have Valentina and Amy on board and we hope they both enjoy their time with us. Mrs Astley will be going on maternity leave at the end of term one and a replacement for her will be announced later in the term. Nikola Ballard in the Office will be working four days a week this year from 8.00am-12.30pm Monday and 8.30am-1pm Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

I am really impressed with how well our students and families have adapted to the rules of the Public Health Order as part of the Red Light Covid-19 Response System. Our Senior Learning Team students have taken mask wearing in their stride and have been positive and amazing with wearing them during the day. Staff are masked and it is really great to see our awesome outside spaces being utilized during the day so that students and staff can have a break from wearing their masks, or get some fresh air. I have also been impressed with the senior students taking responsibility, asking for mask breaks when they feel the need. We are doing our very best at Pine Hill School to ensure school is safe and as normal as possible, under the Public Health Order. We are now in Phase 2 of the Red Light System with minimal changes at school, including: students having designated areas to play at breaks and extremely minimal mixing of students and staff if required.

It is a rather quiet start to the school year. The Senior Learning Team overnight camp at Otago Museum has been postponed until Thursday/Friday 16th/17th June and we are undertaking school swimming in weeks 3 and 4 of term 2. Beach Education has been postponed until 2nd December. Due to the nature of the current environment, we will not be holding Goal Setting Interviews this term. #### **ABSENCES**

Please ring/text the School Office and inform us if your child/ren are going to be absent from school for any reason. Please ensure you give us a reason for their absence when you phone to inform us. It is part of our Health and Safety policy to know where students are when they're absent.

#### **HEAD LICE**

Head lice are active at school. Treatment of head lice has to be done thoroughly. There are a number of ways to do this but one of the best ways is to cover the hair in conditioner to stun the lice. You then need to comb through the hair strands carefully and pull out any eggs along with removing the live lice. The egg cases can be empty but are still really sticky and need to be pulled out by hand or fine metal comb. The live eggs are dark and live approximately 1mm from the scalp. Live lice crawl around the head. Please check your child/ren's hair.

If we notice lice in a child's hair we will contact you so that you can organise treatment. **ALL** long hair **MUST** be tied up. If you would like a treatment kit, please contact us as we have these available for free.

A resolution has been passed and accepted to fold the Friends of Pine Hill School Dunedin group. This resolution was passed at the AGM in November 2021 and has been confirmed by digital resolution this week, as per the constitution. #### **CLASS TIME**

The Board was presented with 2021 achievement data in reading, writing and maths and we saw how well the children at Pine Hill School had done for the year. It was excellent to see the progress made in maths, reading and writing. It's very exciting for children, families and our school, when learning and progress is happening. Students are still receiving the Governments Lunches in Schools and the Board has opted in for the \$150 per student School Donation Scheme for the year.
