It has been a seamless move back into level 2 for us here at Pine Hill School. A big thank you to our school community for being so understanding and adaptive to moving back to the guidelines that were in place when we returned to school from lockdown.

A few key guidelines to remember are: students are to stay at home if they are sick, handwashing is the best defence and we do this on a regular basis at school, parents are only able to enter the school grounds in an emergency, students are to be dropped off and picked up from the Hislop St entrance or the Wilkinson St entrance closest to Pine Hill Road and no visitors are able to come to Assembly. We have had to postpone a number of planned school trips to do with our inquiry unit on Dunedin, along with some sports coaching visits, until we are back to level 1. This is a real shame but we must do what is best at a time like this to ensure everyone involved with our school is safe. Currently we are in alert level 2 until Wednesday 26th August at 11.59pm and we look forward to the outcome of the alert level review on Friday 21st August.

Well done to Stella MacGillivray from the Junior Learning Team and Saja Alibrahem from the Senior Learning Team for receiving Principal Awards at Assembly last week. The focus for these awards over the last two weeks had been around our school value of caring. Stella and Saja are such caring students in our school and it was lovely to recognise this by way of these students receiving principal awards.



Last week teaching staff started their professional learning development journey with Rach McNamara from CORE Education around using digital fluency in reading and writing. We are all very excited to be participating in this and we are looking forward to lots of new learning. Rach is working with us for the next year as we have 40 hours of professional learning development to use during this time. The new learnings are going to be hugely beneficial to teaching staff, support staff and students.

Our students are really enjoying the weekly visits from Jayde, Izzy and Cam from the Otago Polytechnic Institute of Sport. We are extremely lucky to have these visits with these three sporting gurus and our students look forward to them each week.

On Monday 31st August, Pine Hill School will be **closed**. The Board of Trustees has supported me in closing the school so that everyone can have a long weekend as there are no long weekends this term. It is great to be able to have this weekend built into our school term to acknowledge the importance of well-being, so staff and students can have an extra day to rejuvenate during a busy term, and also a very disruptive year.

JUNIOR LEARNING TEAM UPDATE

The Junior Learning Team have been really impressing Miss Hodges and Miss Riley over the past two weeks and are loving being back into normal routines and programmes. We have been learning about Mihimihi and why these are so important in Māori culture. We have all written our own Mihimihi and have been practicing hard to learn how to correctly read and pronounce them. Some of us were even brave enough to share them at our assembly last week. We have also been loving our new inquiry topic; Dunedin: A Pretty Good Plan D - What's in Our Backyard? We have been learning all about Dunedin and the JLT are already extremely engaged with their learning. So far we have been finding out what everyone knows about Dunedin and posing any wonderings we have so we can learn more. We have just started learning more about some chosen places around Dunedin such as Larnach's Castle and Mount Cargill.

SENIOR LEARNING TEAM UPDATE

Over the past two weeks the Senior Learning Team has been stuck into lots of new learning for Term 3. For inquiry, we have been researching Dunedin. Each student has chosen a different place/thing to research within Dunedin and will be writing a report on this topic in the coming weeks. During maths time we have been working hard on refining our addition and subtraction strategies. I am very impressed with the tamariki 's attitude towards giving new strategies a go during this time. We have also been working hard on saying our numbers in te reo Māori from 1-1000. The SLT has embraced the challenge and we have had heaps of fun working out how to say each number using place value houses and playing cards. BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING


