I can not stress enough the importance of notifying us of absences, and the reason. Appointments for students should be made outside of school time. We understand that dental/doctor/optometrist/specialist appointments, for example, may be during school hours which is fine. We do however expect that students come to school after their appointment or come to school, are picked up for their appointment and then return to school. Students can not be having the whole day off school when they have an appointment that takes up a small part of the day. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding with these matters.

The Board of Trustees have received the draft ERO report from the visit that was undertaken a few weeks ago by the Education Review Office. This report is very positive and we look forward to sharing it with our community when it is confirmed in the coming weeks.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATE: KIRSTYN STANAWAY - BOARD CHAIR

Kia ora koutou, greetings all. Our latest Board of Trustees meeting was held on 14/09/2020 at school. We had a visit from Chris Morris who works for the Ministry of Education and has been working alongside the school throughout the longitudinal ERO review. He was reporting to us about student achievement data. The data is showing that students are making progress in their learning. This information coupled with an excellent visit from the Education Review Office, is making for very positive outcomes for Pine Hill School. When ERO were in the school a few weeks back, they were very pleased with the leadership from Melissa and evidence of the hard work being put in from all staff. We will have the confirmed ERO report in the very near future, which just cements what a great place our school is for students to receive a well rounded education. We are part of the Otepoti ki te Raki Kahui Ako, which is a cluster of learning institutes from North Dunedin, working together to share knowledge and resources amongst the group with working towards common goals. Part of this is that we get a Learning Support Coordinator who comes into school and supports the teaching staff, with learning support. Supporting students learning and engagement is something that Pine Hill is thriving in, with a holistic approach to children. This is another area for the school to feel proud in, for the work they're doing. We will be holding staggered (mid term) elections for the Board of Trustees next term.
