The term is disappearing before our eyes. This is the second last newsletter for 2020.

Congratulations to Ossian Gordon from the Junior Learning Team and Jasper Lo Tam from the Senior Learning Team for receiving Principal Awards at Assembly on Friday. For the last two weeks, we had been focusing on the key competency of participating and contributing. We are very proud of Ossian and Jasper who are both very deserving recipients of these awards.





Recently the Board of Trustees have had two teaching positions advertised for 2021. At the weekend interviews were held for these positions and I am pleased to announce on behalf of the board that Amy Riley and Hazel Astley have been appointed to these positions. Amy has been team teaching with Renee Hodges this year and will be teaching year 1 and 2 (Junior Learning Team) in 2021. Hazel has recently moved back to Dunedin after teaching in Wellington for three years and she will be teaching our year 5 and 6 class (Senior Learning Team) in 2021. Renee Hodges will be teaching our year 3 and 4 class (Middle Learning Team) next year. We are really excited to have Amy and Hazel working with us next year. Charlie Parson, our current year 5 and 6 teacher, is moving back to Wellington in the holidays. Thank you Charlie for your contribution to Pine Hill School and we wish you all the best for your future.

Last year the Government gave most state schools in New Zealand money based on their 1st July roll numbers to spend on property projects by mid 2021, called the School Investment Package (SIP). Our school was allocated \$50 000 and the Board of Trustees chose to put this money towards re-fencing three boundaries of the school as this is in need. However the project came in at a significant amount over and above this allocated money from the School Investment Package (SIP) due to the sheer size of our school grounds. Both of our playgrounds are also in need of being re-barked and this was another significant cost. The Board of Trustees resolved to apply for a grant to the Otago Community Trust to fund the rest of the fencing project and the bark to re-bark both of our playgrounds. This was titled as a 'landscaping project' on the grant application. Two weeks ago I received a phone call from the Otago Community Trust to inform me that the landscaping grant application I put into them had been accepted and they would fully fund the other \$41 000 to allow us to re-fence three boundaries of our fence and fund both playgrounds to be re-barked. A huge thank you to the Otago Community Trust for their generosity. It is amazing that this project can happen thanks to their contribution as the extra funds needed were out of reach for our small school to fund ourselves. The clearlite on the front of the main block will be getting replaced in the near future and a new heat pump will be added to Room 1. Soon we have an office being refurbished for our Learning Support Coordinator. These three projects are funded by the Ministry of Education and we look forward to all of these projects getting underway.

JUNIOR LEARNING TEAM UPDATE

The Junior Learning Team have had another busy few weeks at school. We finished off our procedural writing topic by writing our own recipe for gluten free cookies. SENIOR LEARNING TEAM UPDATE

The Senior Learning Team has had an amazing past two weeks at school. Last week while Miss Parson was on release, Mrs M was teaching the class. The SLT have been investigating different myths and legends for their retell writing topic. For art, the SLT have designed a hot air balloon and are currently in the process of using paper mache to create their base shape which they will then paint. For Te Reo Māori the SLT have been learning how to ask and respond to how they are feeling and have been learning to say colours in Māori. The SLT enjoys using Kahoot to practise new vocabulary learnt from their Māori learning. During maths time the SLT have been learning about how to accurately read scales and record their measurements. Students have also enjoyed their squash coaching sessions.
