It's great to see our school attendance percentages climbing again after a tough winter full of bugs and sicknesses. Our school-wide focus is maintaining a daily attendance rate of 95% (currently 91%), as it's crucial for the' success of our tamariki. When tamariki are fit and well, it's vital that they are at school, as regular attendance has a huge positive impact on both their academic achievement and the development of their social skills. We also want to remind everyone to please ensure tamariki are not arriving late to school. Being late can make tamariki feel flustered and causes them to miss the important organisation and settled start to the learning day. Thank you for your continued cooperation with attendance.

This is a reminder that our school will be **closed on Thursday** due to strike action being undertaken by members of NZEI Te Riu Roa (teachers and principals). Our staff do not take this decision lightly, and we sincerely apologise for the disruption this causes to whānau. We are taking this action to urge the Government to properly address the significant issues facing the education sector. These issues include the need for better investment to attract and retain quality teachers, for more support for tamariki with complex needs in the classroom, and for pay and conditions that reflect the essential and complex work educators do. Our collective agreement claims are ultimately about ensuring the best possible learning conditions for our tamariki. We greatly appreciate your understanding and cooperation as our dedicated staff stand up to advocate for the future of public education. Thank you for supporting us.
