These two contracts are extremely beneficial to our school and we look forward to building on the work we have done with them both throughout 2022.

This week at our first Board of Trustees meeting for the year, Kirstyn Stanaway stepped down as a trustee. We are thankful to Kirstyn for her efforts during her time as a board member, especially in the Presiding Member role. We welcome Amie Hawkins into the role of Presiding Member.

JUNIOR LEARNING TEAM (JLT) UPDATE - MRS ALVAREZ FARIAS

What a great start to the year! It has been busy in the Junior Learning Team getting to know each other and starting our new classroom routines. We've welcomed Teroina, Parua and Joseph to our class.

In the JLT, we've started with an amazing Play Based Learning programme for tamariki. We have been working on our fine motor skills, creativity, and problem-solving skills during this time. Every two weeks we have a focus, for example sharing, being responsible, being respectful or being kind. Tamariki have been great at working as a team, taking turns and sharing. In the past few weeks, the JLT have been learning about our new daily routines.

During reading time, we have been working on several different stations such as literacy games, buddy reading, cut-and-paste literacy activities, and reading big books etc. Tamariki have been working hard on being independent with their tasks and trying their best with them. In maths, we continue to work with different activities and our tamariki are completing work according to their abilities.

Everyone has been putting their best effort into the junior room responsibilities and they are getting better at taking care of our classroom things. Every Monday and Friday we have been enjoying catching up with the Senior Learning Team, doing some buddy reading where we explore all sorts of different books and sometimes learn about new things! We are looking forward to continuing to work hard, putting our best effort into our learning!

SENIOR LEARNING TEAM (SLT) UPDATE - MR COOK

It has been an excellent start to 2023 for the Senior Learning Team, what a lovely bunch of tamariki! It has been very exciting welcoming Nembeka, Privilege, Ivy and Alex into the SLT and also a number of tamariki from the Junior Learning Team. I have also been made to feel very welcome and the tamariki have been awesome helping me to get to know school routines etc. I like the PB4L system here at school and it goes well with one of my favourite sayings 'Do the Mahi, get the Treats'.

We have been thoroughly enjoying all of the amazing weather and getting outdoors and doing PE and fitness regularly. Pine Hill School is blessed with a wonderful array of spaces and also has so much fabulous sports equipment which really enhances our PE sessions.

It has been great to re-establish the buddy reading programme and it is lovely to see the fantastic tuakana-teina approach in action here at school.

Our maths work has largely been focused on basic facts and looking at the relationship between adding and subtracting and also the relationship between multiplication and division. We will be working on consolidating our knowledge of place value over the next few weeks. The SLT ākonga (learners, students) enjoyed our work around Chinese New Year at the start of the year and we are looking forward to our upcoming social studies topic work which will see us research various countries around the world. We are going to be researching countries we either have an interest in or a special connection to. I have been impressed with our current affairs news oral language sessions at the start of the day. There have been a variety of topics discussed and some of the questions and ideas shared have been excellent. Keep this up SLT!
