CLASSROOM UPDATE: MISS DUNCAN AND MRS ALVAREZ FARIAS

It's hard to believe we are already coming to the end of Term 1. It has been a very busy and enjoyable term across all of our classes, with lots of new learning, exciting opportunities, and tamariki settling well into the school year. A highlight in the term was our Goal Setting Interviews. These went really well, and it was wonderful to meet with whānau to talk about the learning goals for the year ahead and what is going well. Thank you to all of the parents/caregivers who came along. It was also lovely to meet some new faces in our school community. Two weeks ago, our Year 5 and 6 tamariki were lucky enough to head down to the Logan Park Turf with Miss McGoff for a Game On Day. They had the opportunity to try a range of different sports, and Miss McGoff said everyone had a fantastic day. Throughout March, Pine Hill School has been taking part in the Move It March Challenge, which encourages tamariki to walk, scooter, or bike to school with being more active on their way to and from school. Each morning in classes we have been counting how many tamariki walked or wheeled to school, recording this on class charts. At the end of the month, we send our results back and our classes/school go into the draw to win prizes. It has been awesome to see so many more tamariki choosing to walk or wheel to school when they are able to. A few weeks ago, Scout from Move It March visited our school and got all of the tamariki involved in a fun walk around the block, followed by drawing pictures on the driveway with chalk. The tamariki had a great time and enjoyed getting active together! Today, our Year 3 and 4 girls are excited to be attending the Spirit Sisters Rippa Rugby Carnival/Tournament. Miss Duncan and Miss Ward are taking them along, and we know they will have a great time participating and representing our school. Last Monday, Room 1 and Room 2 tamariki were lucky to have a visitor from the Dunedin City Council, who ran a Dog Safety Education Session. Tamariki learned about how to keep themselves safe around dogs. They were very engaged, listened carefully, and really enjoyed having a dog visit their classrooms. Across the school, we have also continued learning about our term theme, The Winter Olympics. It has been fantastic to see the different ways each class has explored this topic. The tamariki have been very engaged and excited to learn about the sports, athletes, and countries involved. TRANSITION TO SCHOOL - FOUR YEAR OLDS

Each term at Pine Hill School, we hold Transition to School visits for all four year olds. These visits allow new tamariki to become familiar with the school environment. These sessions are held over three different dates each term, and the remaining date for **Term 1** is: **Wednesday 1st April**. Tamariki are welcome to come for morning tea at 10:40am, and then spend the middle block from 11:00am - 12:30pm with the Room 1 tamariki. They are also invited to stay for lunch, with being collected at 1:00pm. If you would like your tamariki to attend, please RSVP to Mrs Alvarez Farias at school.

HEAD LICE

Head lice are active at school, please check the hair of your tamariki. Treatment of head lice has to be done thoroughly. There are a number of ways to do this but one of the best ways is to cover the hair in conditioner to stun the lice. You then need to comb through the hair strands carefully and pull out any eggs along with removing the live lice. The egg cases can be empty but are still really sticky and need to be pulled out by hand or fine metal comb. The live eggs are dark and live approximately 1mm from the scalp. Live lice crawl around the head. We will contact you so that you can organise treatment if we see head lice or eggs in your tamariki's hair. **ALL** long hair **MUST** be tied up. If you would like a treatment kit, please contact us as we have these available for free.

Our last Assembly of Term One will be on **Thursday 2nd April** at 12pm in the hall. Tamariki are welcome to go home after this for the holidays. If you plan on doing this, please let us know via text/email or informing a staff member at school. We look forward to seeing lots of you at Assembly.
