Kia ora, Hello, Kia orana, Talofa lava, Malo e lelei, Bula vanaka, Marhabaan, Salaam, Namaste, Kumusta, Asalaam alaikum, Hola, Welkam

The term is flying by with this week being week six. There has been lots of fantastic learning taking place across our school and we have started our Matariki topic which is our next theme focus this term, working towards our school Matariki Celebration on **Thursday 27th June.** 

Last year we began our Structured Literacy journey and we have seen some excellent progress and results from using this approach to teach literacy. The Government has mandated this programme in primary schools and it is great that we are already doing this and have seen how positive the programme is for our tamariki. All teaching staff are undertaking professional development and we are excited to keep building our knowledge and understanding around Structured Literacy.

Last week, teaching staff undertook a Teacher Only Day that introduced us to the curriculum refresh - Te Mātaiaho. Te Mātaiaho has eight learning areas, which are being developed and released in phases. Schools have until the beginning of 2027 to start using the fully refreshed curriculum, although they must use the refreshed mathematics and statistics and English learning areas from the start of 2025. It is designed to give practical effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi and be inclusive, clear, and easy to use. The current government may be making some changes to Te Mātaiaho, which we are waiting to hear about.

Recently tamariki enjoyed a trip to Otago Museum to learn more about space, which is what we have been studying for the first part of the term. Tamariki also got the opportunity to learn about fossils. We are very lucky to have such a fantastic resource on our back doorstep to aide in learning opportunities for our tamariki. At the end of term two, we will be having a learning celebration with our community to share our new learnings about space. Keep an eye out for more information about this very soon.

It has been brought to my attention that there has been a number of dogs with their owners from the Pine Hill area on the school grounds outside of school hours. A reminder that dogs are **not** allowed on our grounds and I ask that this is respected. There are big signs on our school gates stating that dogs are not allowed and they can not be missed. If you know of anyone using our grounds with their dogs, please ask them to take them elsewhere to exercise/play with them.

In writing, we are looking forward to the next couple of weeks, finishing off different tasks and continuing to make the most of different learning opportunities within the classroom.

## SENIOR LEARNING TEAM UPDATE - MR LANE

What an awesome and busy start to term two it has been in the SLT! To begin with, we welcomed Isabella into our class and the school. In between our regular programme of daily reading, writing and maths we have had numerous opportunities to take our learning outside the normal routines of the classroom. We had a visit from an expert to teach us about the history of the Moa, went to the Logan Park High School production of The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, and during a visit to Otago Museum we took a trip around the solar system in their planetarium. Speaking of the Solar system, the SLT is a storm of newsprint and glue as we attempt to build a scale model of our solar system as part of our inquiry into space!. It has been a great opportunity for us to mix our study of collage in art and space in science all together to create something special. There will also be an associated slide-show to go with it that will give us an opportunity to use the descriptive writing we have been working on during literacy. In maths we have conducted statistical investigations into subjects of interest to the ākonga and we've also been exploring how to use Te Reo to help us understand place value. To top it all off we've been talking about our learning goals and reflecting on ways to achieve them every week so feel free to have a chat about them at home with your tamariki.
