It is hard to believe we are over halfway through term two. The weeks seem to be flying by and there are still lots of things to fit in before the end of the term.

We had a very good professional learning development day on Tuesday at our Teacher Only Day. Our jobs are extremely busy and these days are important for us as it allows us time to delve into our school professional learning focuses. We have been looking at digital fluency through reading and writing and we spent a very productive day working with our facilitator Rach McNamara from CORE Education.

This term we are studying 'From Then to Now - How Did We Get Here?' This is part of the social studies curriculum and covers the continuity and change strand. Classes have begun delving into this topic and had a great trip to Toitū Settlers Museum today as part of the finding out stage of Kath Murdoch's inquiry cycle that we follow. There was lots of fabulous learning that took place and the students' task now, is to reorganise this information as part of the third stage of the inquiry cycle. Students are also looking forward to hearing some guest speakers over the next few weeks for more of the finding out stage and the Middle and Senior Learning Teams also have a trip to Olveston House. We are very lucky to have amazing places to visit, and wonderful people to speak to our students, about this topic. Students will be moving off into an area of their own interest related to the topic, for the going further part of the inquiry cycle.

In the coming weeks students will be learning about Matariki and we will be sharing this learning with our school community. Please keep an eye out for dates confirming how and when we will be celebrating this very important event.

Mid year reports will be coming home on Wednesday 7th July for all students who started school up until mid March this year. As you can understand, it is not appropriate to write reports for students who have recently started school as they need time to settle. There will be Student Led Conferences in early term three that all students will attend, and lead conversations with whānau around their learning at school.

This term, Ōtepoti Ki Te Raki - North Dunedin Community of Learning are holding a parent/whānau session at our school on the **17th June from 5.30pm-6.30pm** called *Let's Talk Teeth.* The kaupapa of this session is dental hygiene and the importance of this for early oral language skills. This has been identified as a key concern voiced across the North Dunedin kāhui. There will be two guest speakers: Amberleigh Stenhouse (speech/language therapist) and Lisa Hansen (Dentist). Tea and coffee and childcare are available. Feel free to come along to this very informative session.

#### JUNIOR LEARNING TEAM (JLT) UPDATE

The Junior Learning Team has been working hard over the past two weeks. Students have thoroughly enjoyed their swimming lessons and have improved both in their water safety skills and overall confidence in the water. Miss Riley was really impressed to see students going outside of their comfort zone and trying their best. Students have been working hard to improve the quality of their reading 'Must do' and 'May do' tasks. Some children have started to delve into creative writing for one of their reading 'May Dos' and have been blowing Miss Riley away with their creativity! We have also been generating questions surrounding our new Inquiry topic and the JLT are especially interested in school life back in the day. We enjoyed our trip to Toitū and look forward to hearing from our guest speakers to help aid the 'finding out' process of this inquiry!

#### MIDDLE LEARNING TEAM (MLT) UPDATE

The Middle Learning Team have been busy completing some fantastic learning over the last two weeks. We have been diving into our new inquiry *'From Then to Now - How Did We Get Here?'* So far we have brainstormed all the things we know about this topic, looked at some thought provoking images from the past and have posed some inquisitive questions and wonderings that we want to know more about. We had a great trip to Toitū and have some exciting guest speakers coming to speak to us who might be able to answer some of our questions. After a long wait, we had our second week of swimming and it certainly did not disappoint. We were busting at the seams everyday to get down to the pool to develop our water confidence and swimming skills. Miss Hodges was thrilled by the progress we all made throughout the week.

# SENIOR LEARNING TEAM (SLT) UPDATE

The SLT have been splashing their way into the second half of the term. Students stunned us with their swimming and put in huge amounts of effort to learn new skills. For inquiry, we are studying *'From Then to Now - How Did We Get Here?* SLT students began exploring key events in New Zealand's history and learnt notation skills in the process. Students have also been exploring what they already know about the past and were interested in how technology has changed over time. Trees waved and the wind whispered in writing, as students tried out their hand at personification.
