This is the final newsletter of Term 2. We are nearly halfway through the 2025 school year, which is incredible. Time flies and we have achieved lots throughout the first six months of school. At our final Assembly of Term 2 next week, we will be sharing our Matariki learning at 12pm in the hall. Whānau and friends are invited to stay for an optional picnic lunch with their tamariki at the conclusion of the Assembly. Tamariki can go home for the holidays with their whānau/guardians after the picnic. We look forward to sharing our learning and celebrating Matariki with everyone.

Attendance continues to be a major focus for us. Well done to the Middle Learning Team who were awarded the Attendance Shield at our most recent Assembly. They had 94% daily attendance over the three weeks leading up to Assembly and the Junior Learning Team had 93% daily attendance with the Senior Learning Team having 92% daily attendance. The race was close! Our whole school daily attendance goal (set by the Board) is 95% and currently we are sitting at 94% which is super close to our goal! At our last Assembly for the term, there will be some awards going out for those with high attendance. Thank you to everyone for their support with our attendance focus, ensuring tamariki are at school when they are fit and able. However, we still have tamariki coming into school late, please ensure they are at school before 8.55am so they can get organised for the day. The first bell of the day rings at 9am. Tamariki are welcome at school from 8.30am and being here well before the first bell rings, allows them time to get organised and spend some time with their friends.

We've become increasingly aware of concerns regarding social media and its impact on our tamariki. It appears that some tamariki are inadvertently exposed to inappropriate content online, which is unfortunately then influencing their behavior and interactions within the school environment. We urge all parents and caregivers to please monitor what your tamariki are viewing on screens at home, as this vigilance is crucial in helping us maintain a safe and positive learning space for everyone. Thank you for your support with this.

This Wednesday and Thursday Miss Culbert and myself are heading off on their bienniel overnight camp to the Otago Museum with the Senior Learning Team. We are all looking forward to an exciting and busy couple of days!

As Term 2 wraps up, I want to acknowledge the fantastic effort and learning that has taken place. Our tamariki have worked incredibly hard, showing great dedication to their learning. It's been a busy and productive term, and we're proud of everything our tamariki have achieved. Mid year school reports will be sent home on Wednesday next week.

JUNIOR LEARNING TEAM (JLT) UPDATE: MISS WARD & MRS ALVAREZ FARIAS

We have had a busy, jam packed Term Two with lots of exciting things happening! We had a visit from Ted the DCC dog, to learn about how to keep ourselves safe around dogs we aren't too sure of. The JLT have had a special focus on Natural Weather Phenomena and Natural Disasters this term, and we have really enjoyed diving deeper and unpacking what these are. We've looked at tornadoes, hurricanes, blizzards, tsunami's, and different ways to show what we have learnt. We have made some posters, drawn pictures, and have created our own art collages to go with our learning. Our visit to Tūhura Otago Museum was awesome as we got to watch an interesting movie about the weather, and witness some crazy science experiments. Miss Ward even joined in! Matariki is coming up, so we have started talking about and researching what it is. We created another art collage, with the seven stars of Matariki being our main focus. Our swimming lessons were something we also really enjoyed, and everyone showed great determination and skills when it came to getting in the water. Writing lately has been about how we can be good friends to each other, and what that looks like at school. We are excited about all the awesome learning we have done this term! We hope all our tamariki enjoy the upcoming school holidays!

MIDDLE LEARNING TEAM (MLT) UPDATE: MISS DUNCAN

The tamariki in the Middle Learning Team have been working very hard these past few weeks! We really enjoyed swimming and learnt a lot of new skills that we can use in the water. The tamariki have been focusing on learning about Natural Weather Phenomena and Natural Disasters. Our focus has been on volcanoes, hurricanes, tsunamis and Earthquakes. First, tamariki looked at what these disasters are, what causes them and what we can do to stay safe during one, then we made some collage pieces of art to go along with them. The MLT have been really interested in learning about these Natural Weather Phenomena and Natural Disasters! For writing, we are learning about instructional writing. Tamariki have learnt that having clear steps, time order words, and imperative verbs are very important when writing a set of instructions. In reading, tamariki have been excited to get back into our rotations after two weeks of swimming and have all been doing reading responses linked in with our theme. It is great to see how each of them are helping one another and working together to answer questions. The Middle Learning Team enjoyed the trip to Otago Museum for our topic study and enjoyed the visit from the DCC around dog safety. It was awesome for tamariki to build on their swimming skills at our recent lessons and they are all ready for a well deserved holiday break after a busy term!

SENIOR LEARNING TEAM (SLT) UPDATE: MISS CULBERT

The Senior Learning Team has had a busy and exciting Term Two, packed with learning and special experiences. Our swimming lessons were a big highlight, with everyone making great progress in the water. We also enjoyed a trip to see a musical at Logan Park High School, took part in a dog safety session, and learned about emergency preparedness from Civil Defence. The biggest buzz right now is our upcoming overnight camp at the Otago Museum this Wednesday! We're thrilled to be sleeping among the exhibits and have a full evening of educational and exciting activities planned. The fun continues the next day with a trip to Moana Pool! We can't wait to share all our adventures with you when we return! In class, we've been diving into our theme of Natural Weather Phenomena and Natural Disasters, which connects across our reading, writing, and topic learning. Our current writing focus is report writing, and we're learning about the Christchurch Earthquakes to build our research skills. We've also started preparing for Matariki in art, creating beautiful work that will be displayed in our classroom and the school office. TRANSITION TO SCHOOL - FOUR YEAR OLDS
